Housing Students in our Summer ESL programs are eligible to live on-campus. Students in the 6.5-week programs (IEBP-G and IEP-G) will be hosted though our on-campus housing office and they will need to apply for a residence room by emailing gchousing@mun.ca. The nightly rate should be between \$17.51 and \$18.78, depending on the student's room assignment. Students will need to bring items to furnish these rooms (or purchase them upon arrival). Students in the 5-week Summer Language & Culture Program will be hosted through our Conference Services Office. The nightly rate should be \$20.29. These rooms will include some amenities such as bedsheets, towels, and food preparation items. All students living in on-campus accommodations will have private rooms and semi-private bathrooms. Fees may be paid by bank transfer using the Convera platform, or by MasterCard/Visa on the Memorial Self-Service portal prior to arrival. After arrival, fees may be paid in cash, traveler's cheques, money order, debit card (from a Canadian bank) or using Visa/MasterCard on the Memorial Self-Service portal. Payment methods may be different for 5-week and 6.5week program students. Details and instructions will be available upon acceptance. ESL program The Summer Language and Culture Program at Grenfell Campus offers students opportunities to improve their speaking, summary listening, reading, writing, grammar, and vocabulary skills while at the same time experiencing local culture first-hand. Students will take part in language programming in the mornings and enjoy a series of excursions and cultural activities in the afternoons, evenings, and on select weekends. In-class language instruction time will total 90 hours throughout the duration of the program. The Summer Session of the Intensive English Bridge Program (IEBP-G) and Intensive English Program (IEP-G) at Grenfell Campus involve a combination of in-class language sessions and out-of-class cultural activities in order for students to obtain significant language development as well as a meaningful cultural immersion experience. Student Population

There are approximately 1500 students registered in undergraduate and graduate programs at Grenfell Campus of Memorial University in our Fall and Winter semesters. Throughout the pandemic, these students have taken part in fully online, inperson, and hybrid courses, depending on changing circumstances.

Campus facilities
